Philadelphia City Office of Food Protection (215) 685-7495	Required –Must have a Certified Food Protection Manager on premise during hours of operation or when food is being prepared. Philadelphia Code, 6-301.8(a) http://www.phila.gov/health/units/ehs/Food_Protection_Off.html	Hours of instruction 16hr ServSafe course approved, Recertification every 5 years
Chester County (610) 344-6225	Required-Every owner/manager of a food service establishment must be certified. At no time shall a food service establishment be without a certified manager. (Chester County Food Protection Regulations, Ch. 300)	Hours of instruction 16, 6hr recertification every 3 years
Montgomery County (610) 278-5117	Required – Each establishment must employ at least one full-time, certified employee.	Hours of instruction 15, 6hr recertification every 3 years
Allegheny County (410)-313-1911	Required-Every food facility where potentially hazardous food is prepared must employ a full-time Food Protection Manager approved or certified by the Allegheny Dept. of Health. (County Code, 3-336.1)	Hours of instruction 10.5, 4hr recertification every 3 years
Bucks County (215) 345-3318	Required –Must have a Certified Food Protection Manager on premise during hours of operation or when food is being prepared.	Hours of instruction 16, 6-8hr recertification every 3 years
City of Lansdale (215) 361-8337	Required-A certified manager must be on premises during business hours.	Hours of instruction 16, 6-8hr recertification every 3 years
